A Message From Kathy:

On a daily basis I am informed, motivated and energized by the purposefulness of our program. It is awe-inspiring to watch the students develop confidence in themselves by attaining their learning goals! They are able to access curriculum, become agents of their own learning and are applying those skills to self-regulate, navigate friendships and solve conflicts.

Our first graders say, "I am strong (flexing their arms), I am smart (touching their heads), I am kind (touching their hearts) and I am happy (hugging themselves). Today, a first grader who was working on self-regulation added..."I am creative, I am flexible and I am calm" on his own accord with no prompt, because that is what he believes about himself.

Yesterday, there was arguing that resulted in recess being cut short for some of our fourth graders. After some hems and haws about the reflective writing assignment attached to addressing the incident, scholars owned their actions and the outcomes were of empathy and understanding. We used this incident as a teaching opportunity to stop and evaluate why kindness, respect and inclusivity matter.

The above two examples are real-time experiences that illustrate who we are, what our niche is and why Activ8 Academy is thriving. Caring, thoughtful teachers, engaged, motivated students and awesome parent partners paired with the privilege of small classes and our applied behavior approach create an environment that all schools and teachers wish for. Travel Reminder: COVID-19

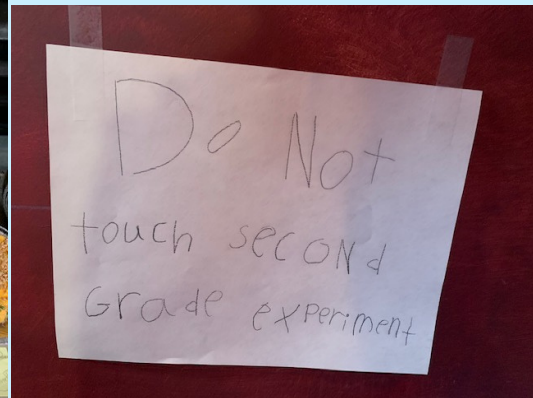
A friendly reminder that any families traveling over the break must have a negative test before returning to school.
