A Message From Kathy:

Has this ever happened to you when your child gets in the car after school? You are so excited to see them and curious about their day you are almost bursting with questions, so you get started:

"Hey! How was school today?"

"Good." Your child says already grabbing a book or snack.

...and the conversation is over.

Talking to your child daily about school is a great opportunity for your child to know that you care about their day. It also gives you insights to their peer relationships, school concerns and more. Study after study shows that opening up about your joys, frustrations and victories is important for your child to build self-esteem. When children put their emotions into words, and openly share how they feel, they activate the parts of the brain that deal with self control. Parents, scientists and educators all agree on the importance of talking to children about their days at school.

Some children happily answer questions, and easily open up on their own, while other children need some encouragement to start sharing. The goal in asking questions should be to have fun and enjoy each other. Keep in mind that some kids need to decompress for a little bit after school as they have been working hard academically and socially/emotionally all day. "I love hearing about your day, I can't wait to talk about it." Lets your child know that you are interested and gives them permission to share when they are ready. Follow your child's lead on when to start the conversation.

The following is a mix of questions for kids that are fun and open-ended to strike up conversations and find out what is on your child's heart and mind:

- What was your favorite part of school today?
- What activity did you like the most today? And the least?
- If you could do any moment over at school today, what would it be?
- Which activity/assignment made you feel most confident today?
- What made you smile today?
- If you could change ONE thing about your school what would it be?
- What is something your teacher said to you today that you are still thinking about?
- What is the most interesting thing you learned at school today?
- Who did you sit by at lunch today?
- What did you do that made someone smile today?

3rd Grade Artists




3rd grade learned about the Pegasus in literature and today they got to draw their own.
